1. This Invitation to Bids follows the Procurement Notice (PN) or Procurement Advertisement (PA) No. 004/36/IT for the subject Project/Procurement, which is advertised on Website of NDRMF and PPRA EPADS on 22nd May 2025. While It will appear on PPRA website on 23rd May2025

2. The Procuring Agency has reserved the funds for the procurement planned during the financial years 2024-25. It is intended that part of the proceeds of the fund will be used to cover eligible payment under the subject contract(s).

3. The National Disaster Risk Management Fund now invites **e-bids** from interested and eligible bidders for the subject procurement. The bidding shall be conducted in line with the *Single Stage One Envelope* procedure of the Public Procurement Rules 2004 and *Least Cost Selection* method as envisaged under Public Procurement Rules and Regulations, or Instructions as indicated in Standard Bidding Document issued by the Authority (from time to time), and is open to all potential bidders through PPRA EPAD System (www.eprocure.gov.pk).

4. Bidders are requested to get registered on Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) EPAD System (<u>www.eprocure.gov.pk</u>) to participate in the aforesaid bidding process.

5. Single Bidding document containing detailed terms & conditions for the aforesaid activity may be downloaded (free of cost) from PPRA's website i.e. <u>www.ppra.org.pk</u>, Fund's website i.e. <u>www.ndrmf.pk</u> and from **PPRA's EPAD system**.

6. All bids must be accompanied by a **Bid Securing Declaration** on the format provided in the Bidding Document **Form - 5**. Bidders are required to submit their scanned Bids through PPRA EPAD System (www.eprocure.gov.pk) as per following schedule:-

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


SECTION II: INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS (ITBs)

This Section provides information to help Bidders prepare their Bids. Information is also provided on the submission, opening, and evaluation of Bids and on the award of Contracts.

These instructions are supplemented by Bid Data Sheet in following Section III.

A. Introduction		
1. Scope of Bid	1.1	The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS) invites Bids for the provision of Services as specified in the BDS and Section V – Scope of Work . The successful Bidders will be expected to deliver the Services within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the BDS .
2. Source of Funds	2.1	Source of funds is referred in Clause-2 of Invitation for Bids.
3. Eligible Bidders	3.1	A Bidder may be natural person, company or firm or public or semi-public agency of Pakistan or any foreign country, or any combination of them with a formal existing agreement (on Judicial Papers) in the form of a joint venture, consortium, or association. In the case of a joint venture, consortium, or association, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract. The joint venture, consortium, or association shall nominate a Lead Member as nominated in the BDS, who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the joint venture, consortium, or association during the Bidding process, and in case of award of contract, during the execution of contract. <i>(The limit on the number of members of JV or Consortium or Association may be prescribed in BDS, in accordance with the guidelines</i> <i>issued by the PPRA</i>).
	3.2	The appointment of Lead Member in the joint venture, consortium, or association shall be confirmed by submission of a valid Power of Attorney to the Procuring Agency.
	3.3	Verifiable copy of the agreement that forms a joint venture, consortium or association shall be required to be submitted as part of the Bid.
	3.4	Any bid submitted by the joint venture, consortium or association shall indicate the part of proposed contract to be performed by each party and each party shall be evaluated (or post qualified if required) with respect to its contribution only, and the responsibilities of each party shall not be substantially altered without prior written approval of the Procuring Agency and in line with any instructions issued by the Authority.
	3.5	The invitation for Bids is open to all prospective Service Provider, firms or authorized agents/dealers subject to any provisions of incorporation or licensing by the respective national

3.6	Foreign Bidders must be locally registered with the appropriate
	national incorporating body or the statutory body, before

	initiate the registration process before the bid submission and the
	necessary evidence shall be submitted to the procuring agency

3.7	A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have
	a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Bidders may be
	considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties
	in this Bidding process, if they:
	a) are associated or have been associated in the past, directly or
	indirectly with a firm or any of its affiliates which have
	been engaged by the Procuring Agency to provide consulting
	services for the preparation of the design specifications and
	other documents to be used for the procurement of the
	Services to be purchased under this Invitation for Bids.
	b) have controlling shareholders in common; or
	c) receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from
	any of them; or
	d) have the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid; or
	e) have a relationship with each other, directly or through
	common third parties, that puts them in a position to have
	access to information about or influence on the Bid of another
	Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Procuring Agency
	regarding this Bidding process; or
	f) Submit more than one Bid in this Bidding process.
3.8	A Bidder may be ineligible if –
	(a) he is declared bankrupt or, in the case of company or firm,
	insolvent;
	(b) payments in favor of the Bidder is suspended in accordance
	with the judgment of a court of law other than a judgment
	declaring bankruptcy and resulting (in accordance with the
	national laws) in the total or partial loss of the right to

	(c) legal proceedings are instituted against such Bidder involving
	an order suspending payments and which may result, in

	bankruptcy or in any other situation entailing the total or
	partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of the

	(d) the Bidder is convicted, by a final judgment, of any offence
	involving professional conduct;
	(e) the Bidder is blacklisted and hence debarred due to
	involvement in corrupt and fraudulent practices, or performance failure or due to breach of bid securing
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		declaration.
		(f) The firm, Service Provider and contractor is blacklisted or debarred by a foreign country, international organization, or other foreign institutions for the period defined by them.
	3.9	Bidders shall provide to the Procuring Agency evidence of their eligibility, proof of compliance with the necessary legal requirements to carry out the contract effectively.
	3.10	Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility to the satisfaction of the Procuring Agency, as the Procuring Agency shall reasonably request.
	3.11	Bidders shall submit proposals relating to the nature, conditions and modalities of sub-contracting wherever the sub-contracting of any elements of the contract amounting to the more than ten (10) percent of the Bid price is envisaged.
4. Eligible Services and Related supplementary Services	4.1	All Services and related supplementary services to be rendered under the contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, and all expenditures made under the contract will be limited to such Services and services. For purpose of this Bid, ineligible countries are stated in the section-4 titled as "Eligible Countries".
	4.2	For purposes of this Clause, "origin" means the place where the Services are mined, grown, cultivated, produced, manufactured, or processed, or through manufacture, procession, or assembly, another commercially recognized article results that differs substantially in its basic characteristics from its imported components or the place from where the related services are/to be rendered.
	4.3	The nationality of the Service Provider that supplies, assembles, distributes, or sells the Services and services shall not determine the origin of the Services.
	4.4	To establish the eligibility of the Services and the related services, Bidders shall fill the country of origin declarations included in the Form of Bid.
	4.5	If so required in the BDS, the Bidder shall demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the firm of the Services to deliver in Pakistan (or in respective country in case of procurement by the Pakistani Missions abroad), the Services indicated in its Bid.
5. One Bid per Bidder	5.1	A bidder shall submit only one Bid, in the same bidding process, either individually as a Bidder or as a member in a joint venture or any similar arrangement.
	5.2	No bidder can be a sub-contractor while submitting a Bid individually or as a member of a joint venture in the same Bidding process.
	5.3	A person or a firm cannot be a sub-contractor with more than one bidder in the same bidding process.
6. Cost of Bidding	6.1	The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the Procuring Agency shall in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

7. Contents of Bidding Documents	7.1	The Services required, bidding procedures, and terms and conditions of the contract are prescribed in the Bidding Documents. In addition to the Invitation to Bids, the Bidding Documents which should be read in conjunction with any addenda issued in accordance with ITB 9.2 include: Section I - Invitation to Bids Section II - Instructions to Bidders (ITBs) Section III - Bid Data Sheet (BDS) Section IV - Eligible Countries Section V - Schedule of Requirements/ToR Section VI - Standard Form (Response Schedules) Section VI - Standard Form (Response Schedules)
	7.2	Section VIII - Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) Section IX - Contract Forms The number of copies to be completed and returned with the Bid is specified in the BDS.
	7.4	The Procuring Agency is not responsible for the completeness of the Bidding Documents and their addenda, if they were not obtained directly from the Procuring Agency or the signed pdf version from downloaded from the website of the Procuring Agency. However, Procuring Agency shall place both the pdf and same editable version to facilitate the bidder for filling the forms.
	7.5	The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bidding Documents. Failure to furnish all the information required in the Bidding Documents will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in the rejection of his Bid.
8. Clarification of Bidding Documents	8.1	A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents may notify the Procuring Agency in writing or in electronic form that provides record of the content of communication at the Procuring Agency's address indicated in the BDS.
	8.2	The Procuring Agency will within three (3) working days after receiving the request for clarification, respond in writing or in electronic form to any request for clarification provided that such request is received not later than three (03) days prior to the deadline for the submission of Bids as prescribed in ITB 23.1. However, this clause shall not apply in case of alternate methods of Procurement.
	8.3	Copies of the Procuring Agency's response will be forwarded to all identified Prospective Bidders through an identified source of communication, including a description of the inquiry, but without identifying its source. In case of downloading of the Bidding Documents from the website of PA, the response of all such queries will also be available on the same link available at the website.
	8.4	Should the Procuring Agency deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so

		following the procedure under ITB 9 .
	8.5	If indicated in the BDS, the Bidder's designated representative is
		invited at the Bidder's cost to attend a pre-Bid meeting at the
		place, date and time mentioned in the BDS. During this pre-Bid
		meeting, prospective Bidders may request clarification of the

		aspects of the Bidding Documents.
	8.6	Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting, if applicable, including the text of
		the questions asked by Bidders, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be transmitted promptly to all prospective Bidders who have obtained the Bidding Documents. Any modification to the Bidding Documents that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Bid meeting shall be made by the Procuring Agency exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to ITB 9 . Non-attendance at the pre-Bid meeting will not be a cause for
		disqualification of a Bidder.

A Bid valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by the Procuring Agency as non-responsive. The period of Bid validity will be determined from the complementary bid securing instrument i.e. the expiry period of bid security or bid securing declaration as the case may be.
	17.2	Under exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the initial Bid validity period, the Procuring Agency may request the Bidders' consent to an extension of the period of validity of their Bids only once, for the period not more than the period of initial bid validity. The request and the Bidders responses shall be made in writing or in electronic forms that provide record of the content of communication. The Bid Security provided under ITB 18 shall also be suitably extended. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid security or causing to be executed its Bid Securing Declaration. A Bidder agreeing to the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its Bid, but will be required to extend the validity of its Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration for the period of the extension, and in compliance with ITB 18 in all respects.
	17.3	If the award is delayed by a period exceeding sixty (60) days beyond the expiry of the initial Bid validity period, the contract price may be adjusted by a factor specified in the request for extension. However, the Bid evaluation shall be based on the already quoted Bid Price without taking into consideration on the above correction.
18. Bid Security or Bid Security Declaration	18.1	Pursuant to ITB 11 , unless otherwise specified in the BDS , the Bidder shall furnish as part of its Bid, a Bid Security in form of fixed amount not exceeding five percent of the estimated value of procurement determined by the procuring agency and in the amount and currency specified in the BDS or Bid Securing Declaration as specified in the BDS in the format provided in Section VI (Standard Forms) .



SECTION V: SCOPE OF WORK

Provision, Installation & Configuration of Security Information and Event Management (SIEM) Solution and Allied Services

1. Project Background

1.1 NDRMF is a federal government non-banking financial intermediary exclusively focused to invest in Disaster Risk Reduction, Disaster Risk Financing and Climate Change across Pakistan, especially in most vulnerable regions of Pakistan. NDRMF provides grant financing to public and non-public sector entities for their interventions to reduce the socio economic and fiscal vulnerability of population to natural hazards by prioritizing and financing investments in disaster risk reduction and preparedness with high impacts.

1.2 In this context, NDRMF has engaged M/s SUPARCO to develop the Natural Catastrophe (Nat Cat) Model of Pakistan (Geo-referenced Exposure Database for Catastrophe Project for NDRMF). In the region, it is the first initiative at national level. This NatCat modelling will assess disasters posed by natural hazards including hydro-meteorological (flood, drought, Tropical Cyclone) and Geo-physical (earthquake), to evaluate exposure and vulnerability of elements at risk and will quantify its financial impacts up to Tehsil (sub-district) level. The NaCat modeling outputs include hazards, exposure, vulnerability, and risk assessment against natural hazards (flood, drought, Tropical Cyclone and seismic) of varying frequency and magnitude on national level.

1.3 To host NatCat application NDRMF has deployed a datacenter in National University of Science & Technology (NUST H-12 Islamabad) which is a primary site. The secondary site is at the National Disaster Risk Management Fund (NDRMF) office at EOBI House G-10/4 Islamabad.

1.4 In today's digital era, cybersecurity cannot be ignored. A one cybersecurity incident can lead to exposing the critical information of millions of people. These breaches have a strong financial impact on the companies and loss of the trust of customers. Hence, cyber security is essential to protect businesses and individuals from cybersecurity breaches.

1.5 One essential component of effective cybersecurity is a security information and event management (SIEM) solution. The purpose of this SIEM solution is to enhance the NDRMF's security posture by:

- a. **Centralized Log Management:** Consolidating security logs from various sources (firewalls, servers, network devices, applications, etc.) into a single, unified platform.


